VILLAGE OF GAGETOWN Council Meeting Minutes

Location: Village Office – 41 Front Street, Gagetown Date: April 27th, 2021 - Special Meeting of Council

- 1. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Blaney at 6:30 pm. This meeting was held via teleconference due to the pandemic conditions. Mayor Blaney welcomed those present and those joining via teleconference. Present were Mayor Blaney, Deputy Mayor Pleadwell, Councillor McNamee and Clerk White.
- 2. Call for Motion to Approve Agenda: Moved by Councillor McNamee and seconded by Deputy Mayor Pleadwell to approve agenda as presented. With no questions and all in favour, motion carried.
- 3. Discussion of the Report of Regional Service Commission 11 regarding the "similar to or compatible with" application submitted by the Native Women's Association of Canada for lands located at 188 Tilley Road.
 - a. Mayor Blaney provided some context for the process that is followed when a proponent requests a similar to or compatible with hearing. A report is prepared by RSC11 for the municipal council and an opportunity is given to the local government to accept or reject the recommendation of the RSC11. However, requests of this type are heard by the Planning Review and Adjustments Committee (PRAC) and the decision to allow or deny the request is made by the PRAC.
 - b. Ashley Brown of Regional Service Commission 11 gave a presentation of the report that is before Council for consideration.
 - c. The public has the opportunity to voice its opinion to the Regional Service Commission 11 at any time up to the date of the PRAC hearing.
 - d. Councillor McNamee indicated his support for the application. Deputy Mayor Pleadwell read the Appendix of the report which outlined the details of the project in greater detail. Deputy Mayor Pleadwell also indicated his full support of the project. Mayor Blaney added that residents should take the time to read the report and understand the mission and goals of the Native Women's Association of Canada.

e. It was moved by Deputy Mayor Pleadwell as follows:

Whereas, The Native Women's Association of Canada has made an application to Regional Service Commission 11 to have a Resiliency Lodge considered as similar to or compatible with other uses permitted under the "Resource" Zone in the Village of Gagetown Rural Plan, By-Law No. 37, and

Whereas, the Village of Gagetown Council has considered the April 22nd report prepared for Council by the Regional Service Commission 11, and

Whereas, The Village of Gagetown Council finds no errors or omissions in the Regional Service Commission's April 22nd Report to Council

Be it therefore resolved that:

The Council of the Village of Gagetown recommends that the Regional Service Commission 11 Planning Review and Adjustment Committee allow, subject to the terms and conditions outline in the April 22nd, 2021 Report, a Resiliency Lodge to be located at 188 Tilley Road (PID Numbers 75143989 and 45166295) as being similar to or compatible with uses permitted in the "Resource" Zone of the Village of Gagetown Rural Plan, By-Law No. 37.

The motion was seconded by Councillor McNamee. With all in favour, and none opposed, the motion was carried.

4. Motion to adjourn – it was moved by Deputy Mayor Pleadwell to adjourn the meeting at 6:50pm.
